My pieces are usually life-size, and at least faces and hands are rendered hyper-realistically. Decorations on the bodies, the pedestals, and some found objects connect the figures to various natural or cultural icons.

In Song for the Mimbres I meant to uplift Native American women who decorated some of the most wonderful ceramic pottery of the Mimbres aera. I encountered their work during a visit to the Western New Mexico University Museum in Silver City and was deeply impressed by it.

Growing Another Heart is meant to communicate a new love relationship between two older people as they are emerging from experiences of the past.
